#### Diane M. Antishin, DTE Energy



Ewald is a survivor of child sexual abuse and did not begin the healing process until late in her adult life. Art therapy became a part of her healing process; in particular she gravitated to jewelry design and soon began creating jewelry through her own jewelry making business. This ignited a passion to serve other women recovering from abusive pasts,

through the creative process. In 2015, she launched a social enterprise, Mend on the Move, that provides employment opportunity and a voice for justice on behalf of victims of abuse. Mend on the Move employs abuse survivors to create handcrafted jewelry, providing them with an income, while building confidence and independence. Survivors learn work skills and accountability, but, most importantly, they are a part of a soothing, therapeutic environment that supports and encourages, helping them see themselves as worthy and valuable contributors to society. Ewald has been featured on local television news stories (Channels 2, 4 and 7), as well as print (The Detroit Free Press, Hour Magazine, and Seen Magazine) and, most recently on ABC World News Tonight and USA Today. Ewald was selected out of 150 applicants as one of the top 12 EmpowerHer Pitches for the 2018 Michigan Women's Forward and Ford Fund's competition in support of innovative business ideas of women social entrepreneurs. Mend on the Move was recently named one of the top five jewelry brands in Detroit by Detroit Fashion News and can be found at *mendonthemove.org* and over 25wholesale locations throughout metro Detroit and Michigan, as well as nationally.

Najah Bazzy, Zaman International

Najah Bazzy, RN, is an internationally recognized healer, humanitarian, and interfaith leader who left a six-figure salary as a critical-care nurse to build Zaman International. The Metro-Detroit based non-profit empowers marginalized women and children to break the cycle of extreme poverty. In 2019, she was recognized as a Top Ten CNN Hero, highlighting Zaman's growth from a grassroots team of volunteers to a world-class organization with a global reach that has helped more than 1.8 million people in 20 countries since 2010.

Born and raised in Southeast Michigan, Najah earned her nursing degree from Madonna University and specialized over the past three decades in critical care and transcultural nursing. The CEO of Diversity Specialists, Najah has implemented a national model of transcultural clinical care and hosted workshops for health care institutions across the country. She also serves as an adjunct professor at Michigan State University's Institute of International Health, and hosts transcultural leadership workshops on bereavement and medical ethics for chaplains at Bayan Claremont Theological School. In 1997, she co-founded the Young Muslim Association, now known as the Muslim Youth Connection, and serves as Senior Advisor, providing leadership training to youth.

Najah has been interviewed by national and international media outlets about her work. Recently, Najah was selected as a CNN Hero for 2019. Najah has been profiled on CBS 62's Eye On The Future: The Power of Women. She was featured on a United Way of Southeast Michigan billboard as a source of inspiration to Detroit-area youth.

She founded Lovio George in 1982 in the heart of Midtown Detroit and, today, the agency continues to be recognized as one of the top firms in Michigan. Lovio-George has led some of the region's most notable campaigns for clients, including Huntington Place and the Detroit Regional Convention Facility Authority, Detroit Riverfront Conservancy, Shinola, Walbridge, The Parade Company, the PGA of America and Super Bowl XL Host Committee, DADA, NAIAS and the 2022 Auto Show.

She was the first woman to serve as the Chairman of the Board for the Detroit Metropolitan Convention and Visitors Bureau, and is currently a member of the Executive Committee, Board of Directors, and Chairman of the Nominating Committee. Lovio-George also serves on the Board of Visitors for the College of Fine, Performing, and Communication Arts at Wayne State University. She is a former member of the Corp! Magazine Advisory Board, the Metro Detroit Sports Commission, and the Haven Board of Directors, and is a member of the Detroit Athletic Club.

#### Dr. Cynthia Taueg, Ascension Southeast Michigan

Dr. Cynthia Taueg is Vice President of Community Health Services for Ascension Southeast Michigan, where she is responsible for oversight of numerous community based services and programs including, but not limited to, School-Based Health Centers, Faith Community Nursing, Infant Mortality Reduction Program, and Community Education.

As a native Detroiter, she is passionate about increasing community access to programs and services that seek to prevent disease, improve the quality of life, and promote health equity. She served as a public health nurse and later as the Director and Health Officer for the county and city of Detroit Health Departments. She now serves her community in her current role with Ascension Health. As an advocate for access to health care, she was instrumental in demonstrating the value of integrated primary care, as outlined in a collaborative publication entitled "Taking Care of the Uninsured," written prior to the passage of the Affordable Care Act.

Also, she serves on the Detroit Wayne County Integrated Health Network Board, Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph Foundation Board, and the Inter-FaithHealth & Hope Coalition Board, Wayne State University College of Nursing Board of Visitors, Cabrini Clinic Board, and Advantage Health Centers as an Emeritus Member. She is the recipient of numerous local and national awards, including the American Hospital Association Nathan Davis Award.

Cynthia graduated from Wayne State University with a Bachelor of Science in Nursing Degree. Later she received a Masters Degree in Public Health from the University of Michigan and Doctorate in Health Administration from Central Michigan University.

Dorothy Zehnder is co-founder and co-owner of Frankenmuth Bavarian Inn, an enterprise that includes Bavarian Inn Restaurant and Castle Shops, Covered Bridge Shop, Frank's Muth Store, Frankenmuth River Place Shops, Frankenmuth Gift Shops Inc., Bavarian Inn Lodge, and a line of food products.

Dorothy started waiting tables in 1937 when Bavarian Inn was Fischer's. She and husband William "Tiny" became managers when the family purchased it in 1950. During 1957's recession, they expanded and spearheaded Frankenmuth's transformation into Michigan's "Little Bavaria," changing the restaurant's name and architecture to reflect its German heritage. A restaurant since 1888, it is among the nation's largest independent restaurants, with seating for 1,200.

Dorothy is a civic leader, educator, cookbook author, and mentor in restaurant, tourism, governmental, religious, and philanthropic organizations. At 100, she still works about 6 days a week. She has 3 children, 10 grandchildren, and 22 great-grandchildren, many involved in the business.

Dorothy has numerous awards, including: admission to the Michigan Women's Hall of Fame (2020), Saginaw Chamber's Lifetime Community Service Award, National Association of Women Business Owners Detroit Chapter's Pinnacle Award and more.




